> THE FIVE-YEAR HIGHER EDUCATION JOURNEY AT HEIP

The HEIP program follows the **French university structure over five years**, divided into two cycles (Bachelor's and Master's):

- The Bachelor's degree (Years 1-3)
- The Master's degree (Years 4-5)

For exchange students, **courses are available only in the third years**, providing opportunities for high-level specialization and international collaboration.
