COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

COURSES	COURSE DESCRIPTION
Follow the Press: International Affairs and Politics	This course is a weekly, high-level forum for reviewing and debating the international English-language press. Students dive into current affairs by analyzing lead publications from The Economist, The Guardian, and Harvard Gazette. The program challenges participants to decipher the nuances of global political discourse and sharpens their ability to synthesize complex information from diverse traditional and digital media sources.
Economic Statecraft: How States Use Economics as a Tool of Power	This course explores the strategic intersection of wealth and power, analyzing how nations utilize economic instruments to achieve geopolitical objectives. From trade sanctions to strategic investments, students examine the mechanisms through which economic leverage becomes a primary tool of influence. The curriculum pushes participants to understand the evolving global landscape where economic policy is as critical as traditional diplomacy.
Post-Bipolar World	As global alliances shift and the order of polarity transforms, this course provides a deep dive into the emerging power structures of the 21st century. Students analyze the transition from unipolarity to a multipolar world, focusing on the end of traditional hegemony and the rise of new regional actors. The course prepares students to navigate an international system defined by increasing complexity and shifting centers of influence.
The Politics of Development and the Migration Crisis	This course offers an intensive investigation into the political and economic drivers of development and the resulting challenges of the global migration crisis. Students examine the legal and social frameworks surrounding refugee rights while exploring the pressing challenges of forced migration. The program bridges the gap between theoretical development models and the real-world humanitarian issues facing contemporary societies.
Contemporary Transformations of Societies: Technology, Work, and Power	This course investigates the profound structural changes reshaping modern life, driven by the rapid evolution of technology and digital platforms. Participants analyze how innovation is redefining the nature of labor, social interaction, and political authority. By exploring the impact of automation and AI, the course provides students with the critical tools to understand the future of power in an increasingly digitized global society.
Corporate Sustainability and Responsibility - European Guidelines and Initiatives	This course provides a comprehensive introduction to Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) within its European legal and strategic dimensions. At the center of the debate is the evolving role of companies as stakeholders in societal interests, human rights, and climate justice. Students learn to navigate the European guidelines that push organizations to go beyond profit and contribute actively to sustainable development.
Peace, Conflict, and International Security	This course explores the core theories and practical challenges of maintaining global security in a volatile era. Students analyze the causes of modern conflicts and the mechanisms for peace-building, arms control, and international intervention. The curriculum emphasizes the role of international organizations in managing security threats, preparing students to assess the risks and solutions for global stability.
SHIFT - Hackathon CSR & AI (client-based)	The SHIFT Hackathon is a major, interdisciplinary event where hundreds of students from across the OMNES Education group — including engineering, business, international relations, and communication — unite to tackle a pressing real-world challenge. In this high-energy, competitive setting, cross-functional teams collaborate intensively to develop innovative solutions for a client or industry partner. The event pushes participants to blend their unique expertise and creativity, culminating in a pitch to a panel of experts.
French as a Foreign Language	This course offers an immersive linguistic and cultural journey designed specifically for exchange students across HEIP, ECE, and SUP DE PUB. Organized into three distinct levels—Beginner, Intermediate, and Advanced—the program ensures personalized progress for every student. Beyond the classroom, participants will have the opportunity to participate in curated cultural outings in Paris, exploring the city's iconic heritage and hidden gems.
